

To achieve this aim, the Government will work with all stakeholders, particularly community organisations such as the Aurukun Community Justice Group, to strengthen local partnerships and local participation in the design and delivery of services that reduce alcohol-related harm.

Importantly, I acknowledge that in accordance with s.173H of the *Liquor Act 1992*, the Government is required to consult with the community justice group for the community area about a declaration of prohibition of possession of liquor in a restricted area, or to consider a recommendation made by the community group about changing a declaration.
